






GO Stipend ~ Genesee Opportunity Stipend

All graduating seniors in Genesee County are eligible to the GO Stipend to use toward college or other training opportunities after high school.

TIP ~ Michigan's Tuition Incentive Program

Students can check if they qualify for the TIP Program by calling 888.447.2687. TIP will pay for up to 84 credit hours at all community colleges in the state of Michigan. It is definitely worth a 2 minute phone call.

# Do You Want Help Applying for Financial Aid for Your College Bound Senior?

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid ) Night will be held **Wednesday**, **January 10 from 5—7 pm** here at Davison Alternative. It is very important for parents of senior students who intend to apply to colleges or trade schools to attend this event. **Please complete the FAFSA Worksheet on the back of this page!** 



Parent/Teacher Conferences are also scheduled on this day from 8:30—9:30AM and 4:30—7PM; and again, it is so important for parents of seniors and juniors who intend to graduate in June to attend conferences.

# FSA ID Worksheet

The first step towards receiving money from the state and federal governments to attend college is creating your FSA ID accounts. You'll need this to file the FAFSA.

### Important Notes:

- In most cases, both the student and one parent or legal guardian will need an FSA ID.
- Students and parents/guardians will need to create separate FSA ID accounts.
- Students cannot make FSA ID accounts for their parents, and parents cannot make FSA ID accounts for their students.
- Students will need a social security number to create an FSA ID.
- Parents/Guardians: If you have a social security number, use this to set up your FSA ID.
  - If you do not have a social security number, <u>parents/guardians can still create</u> an FSA ID account.



 In this case, you can use an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) or complete the knowledgebased authentication process on the FSA ID website.

### How to create your FSA ID:

- 1. Go to StudentAid.gov and click on "Create account" on the top right, then click "Get Started."
- Enter an email address:
  - Use your personal email. Students and parents must use separate email addresses.
- Create a username:
  - Must be 6-30 characters. Avoid using personal identifiers like your name or birthday.
- Create a password:
  - Must be 8-30 characters and contain upper— and lowercase letters and numbers.
- Complete your profile by entering your social security number, birthdate, and legal name.
- 6. Verify both your email address and mobile phone number to set up two-step authentication.
  - FSA will send you an email with a code to verify your email address. FSA will send a text
    message with a code used to verify your mobile phone number.
- 7. Keep track of your backup code in case something gets lost:
