Third grade is an exciting time filled with growth, discovery, and new challenges. Throughout the year, your child will develop essential academic skills, foster meaningful friendships, and cultivate a love for learning that will last a lifetime. We are honored to be a part of your child's third-grade experience, and are committed to making this year a memorable and rewarding one for everyone!

While you are not required to provide any supplies for your child to attend Davison Community Schools, you may want to provide these suggested items:

FOR YOUR CHILD

- Small Pencil Box
- 24-count Crayons
- 12-count Colored Pencils
- 2 Glue Sticks
- Scissors

FOR THE CLASS

- Pencils
- Pencil Top Erasers
- Black (Expo Brand) Dry-Erase Markers
- Ruled Index Cards
- 3x3 Post-It Notes
- Kleenex
- Paper Towel

The transition from second grade to third grade can be a big one! In order to make this transition as seamless as possible, here are some skills that you may want to work on over the summer:

- Encourage your child to read every day: Reading is a foundational skill that is essential for success in all subject areas. In third grade, students are moving from "learning to read" to "reading to learn". Encourage your child to read for at least 20-30 minutes every day.
- Practice math skills: Fact fluency (how quickly a student can answer simple math equations like $5+6$ or $11-5$) for addition and subtraction will be critical for your child's math success in third grade. You can also get a jump start on practicing multiplication facts! Students will be expected to have all of their multiplication facts (0-10) memorized by the end of third grade. We recommend starting with their foundational facts (1's, 2's, 5's, and 10's) first!
- Work on writing: Writing is another important skill for success in third grade. Encourage your child to write stories, journal entries, and letters over the summer.

We are very excited to meet your family in August! Have a wonderful summer!

Dear Parents,

We are thrilled about welcoming your child to 4th grade at Siple. Your student will learn a lot of new academic concepts, experience an increased level of responsibility, and have fun at the same time!

The most important skill that your child can bring with them to 4th grade is the quick recall of their basic multiplication facts.

The majority of math skills that will be taught this year will revolve around the mastery of these facts. Although this skill was taught in 2nd grade and worked on in 3rd grade, please take some time out of your busy summer to make sure your child has memorized his or her multiplication facts. We cannot emphasize enough how critical this is to your child's math success in 4th grade. A little bit of practice now will alleviate the task of trying to master these skills while learning new math concepts. It will make new math content easier to understand.
