Return to Learn!

Q: Will Davison Community Schools offer an online option for grades K-12?

Yes. We are currently working on developing online offerings for all of our students, kindergarten through 12th grade, and those options will be available by the time school starts on August 17.

Q: Will there be an online option for preschool?

No. The District will not provide an online option for preschool.

Q: What is the difference between online learning and homeschooling?

With online learning the student has a teacher that provides lessons, assignments, assessments, feedback and determines the students grade or mark in a course or subject. If you choose to homeschool your child it is up to you to find or create the curriculum, assignments and assessments. Your student will not earn credit or receive grades or marks from the District.

Q: Will my child be required to wear a mask?

Maybe. If we are in Phase four (4) of the Governor's "Safe Start" plan, all students and staff will be required to wear a face covering. The only exception is for kindergarten through fifth grade students in a self-contained classroom. Kindergarten - 5th grade students will be required to wear a mask on the bus and in common areas and shared spaces of the school such as hallways.

If we are in phase five (5) of the Governor's "Safe Start" plan, face coverings will be strongly recommended but not required.

Q: If my child does not wear a mask and is required to do so, what will happen?

If we are in Phase four (4) of the Governor's "Safe Start" plan, your child will not be permitted to attend school without a face covering.

Q: Will the district be providing masks, gloves, etc.?

The District will not be providing face coverings for our students. We will have masks available in an emergency if a student needs one but we simply cannot afford to provide a mask to every student.

Q: Will the online option be similar to the distance learning that took place following the school shut down?

No. The online (distance learning) option the District will provide for the 2020/2021 school year will be far more robust and rigorous than what was offered last spring. Students will be required to learn new material online and should plan to spend a minimum of four hours each day working on coursework. Participation, two-way communication with the teacher, assessments, projects, etc. will be mandatory.

Q: If I choose to send my child to school, what precautions will the district be taking to keep him/her safe?

The District will adhere to all the required safety protocols in the Governor's "Return to School Roadmap." All of these safety protocols can be found in the District's Return to School Plan on the District website once it is approved by the Board of Education and Genesee Intermediate School District in August.

Q: If I enroll in another online program, does that mean my student is no longer enrolled at Davison?

Yes. If you enroll your child with any other program not offered by the Davison Community Schools, your child will no longer be considered a Davison student. Before making the decision to enroll your student in another school or program we ask that you contact Davison Community Schools to discuss your options.
